<p><i>Example: Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention (CBCAP)</i> <i>Established by <u>Title II of the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act Amendments of 1996</u>. The purpose of the CBCAP program is:</i></p> <p><i>(1) To support community-based efforts to develop, operate, expand, enhance, and coordinate initiatives, programs, and activities to prevent child abuse and neglect and to support the coordination of resources and activities to better strengthen and support families to reduce the likelihood of child abuse and neglect; and</i></p> <p><i>(2) To foster understanding, appreciation and knowledge of diverse populations in order to effectively prevent and treat child abuse and neglect.</i></p>	<p><i>Use for primary and secondary prevention</i></p> <p><i>Allocation based on population from the state to the counties (min. 20,000 people)</i></p>	<p><i>It can ONLY be used for primary and secondary prevention</i></p>	<p><i>Identify Contact person for CBCAP funding and involve them in conversation as to feasibility of converting current services funded by CBCAP to the potential Evidence-Based Practice(s) (EBP).</i></p>
<p><i>Example: Targeted Case Management (TCM)</i> <i>The TCM program reimburses participating counties for the federal share of costs (typically 50%) for case management services provided to Medi-Cal beneficiaries in specific target populations</i></p>	<p><i>It can be used to fund direct services.</i></p>	<p><i>Need more information and need a contact person.</i></p>	<p><i>Identify contact person for TCM that can provide additional information on whether the chosen EBP can be funded with TCM.</i></p>
