<u>North Carolina Family Assessment Scale - General + Reunification (NCFAS-G+R)</u>	Examine family functioning and readiness for reunification. For use with family members of all ages	Family service worker following home visits	English, Spanish	A (Psychometrics Well-Demonstrated)
<u>The Colorado Family Support Assessment, Version 2.0 (CFSA 2.0)</u>	Assess baseline and follow-up family strengths and needs, and monitor progress towards economic security, health, and increased conditions that protect against child maltreatment. For use with adults and caregivers.	Trained family development workers administer Part A, the family fills out Part B, and Part C is completed using an interview format in partnership with families.	Arabic, English, Spanish, Vietnamese	B (Psychometrics Demonstrated)
<u>Protective Factors Survey (PFS)</u>	Assess the perceived presence of protective factors in caregivers of children	The parent or caregiver	English, Spanish	B (Psychometrics Demonstrated)
<u>Protective Factors Survey, 2nd Edition (PFS-2)</u>	Assess protective factors that prevent child abuse and neglect to assess changes and identify areas programs can focus efforts to strengthen protective factors. For use with parents and caregivers.	Self-administered by parents and caregivers who are receiving child maltreatment prevention services	English	B (Psychometrics Demonstrated)
<u>Trauma and Post-Trauma Well-Being Tool (T/WB)</u>	Measure the functioning of the entire family as it relates to trauma and assesses for trauma and the degree of severity in families with children aged 0-21 *The T/WB is intended to be used in conjunction with the <u>North Carolina Family Assessment Scale (NCFAS)</u> and cannot be used as a stand-alone assessment.	Family service workers	English, Spanish	B (Psychometrics Demonstrated)
<u>Family Development Matrix (FDM)</u>	Assessment and case management system for use as a decision support tool to provide a strength-based family assessment. For use with parents, referrals from child welfare, and clients of family resource centers	Family support workers	Chinese, English, Spanish, Vietnamese	NR (Not Able to be Rated)
